

### **St. Isidore the Farmer** (c. 1070-1130)

Feast Day: May 15

Isidore spent his life as a hired hand in the service of a wealthy Madrilenian landowner. He shared what he had, even his meals, with the poor. Isidore married Maria Torribia and they had one son who later died in his youth. In the morning before going to work, Isidore would usually attend Mass at one of the churches in Madrid. One day, his fellow farm workers complained to their master that Isidore was always late for work in the morning. Upon investigation, the master found Isidore at prayer whilst an angel was doing the ploughing for him. St. Isidore's life story is a reminder of the dignity of work, and that ordinary life can lead to holiness.



### From Fr. Jesse Burish



Praised be Jesus Christ!

The Gospel for this Sunday's Solemnity of the Ascension includes Christ's "Great Commission" of his disciples: "Go into the whole world and proclaim the gospel to every creature." We are reminded today particularly that we are called to spread the gospel and make disciples. That is the great commission we all have as baptized members of the Church, but sadly, it is often jokingly referred to as the "Great Omission" because of how

often we fail to carry this out this responsibility.

The command to "proclaim the good news to every creature" is an interesting way to phrase the Great Commission. Are we supposed to preach to insects and birds and flowers and trees? Probably not, but by saying "every creature" rather than just "every human being," St. Mark is indicating in his gospel the cosmic effects of the Gospel: it is a message that has meaning not just for humanity, but even for nature itself, an idea much explored by Pope Francis in his writings.

But the cosmic implications of the Gospel should not overshadow the fact that the good news is first of all addressed to all humanity, and that faith and the sacraments are necessary for salvation. In our Gospel, we hear that "whoever *believes* and is *baptized* will be saved," which summarizes well the relationship between faith and the sacraments. Both are necessary. Without the sacraments, faith runs the danger of being merely personal, subjective, and individualistic, and fails to incorporate us into the body of Christ. On the other hand, the sacraments without faith devolve into empty externalism and ritualism and fail to bear the fruit of holiness in the life of the individual. We are given the Great Commission to spread the Gospel because faith and the sacraments are *necessary* for salvation.

Our Gospel this Sunday ends with, "But they went forth and preached everywhere, while the Lord worked with them and confirmed the word through accompanying signs." This should be a summary statement of the whole history of Christianity. But we should ask ourselves if it is true for us right now? Is this true of our parishes, our Catholic community, and our own lives personally? A biography of Robert Cardinal Sarah, entitled *God or Nothing*, describes the French missionary priests of the Holy Ghost Fathers (who have also very much been part of the evangelizing work in the early days of our own local community) who arrived in Cardinal Sarah's extremely remote African village just after the end of World War II. There, they preached and baptized hundreds and thousands in that region of Ghana, sometimes at the cost of their lives, as many succumbed to malaria and other dangers of that remote environment. But their faith was so strong it made an indelible mark on the African children they catechized, and firmly planted the Church in that region.

Does this kind of faith still live among us? Do we have the faith of our own ancestors? Do we still have young men and women willing to risk their lives to preach Jesus Christ to every creature? We may not always be able to answer those questions with a strong yes. But we can get there by striving to cultivate within ourselves a missionary discipleship so that we can respond faithfully to our Great Commission. How do we cultivate this? We first work to grow in our own discipleship of Christ through regular and consistent prayer, strong Catholic friendships, regular reception of Confession and the Holy Communion, and constantly striving to learn the Faith better. Are you striving in each of those areas? After that, we should befriend and invest in people that are open to the Gospel and encourage them in those same habits of discipleship, and encourage them to do the same. We should have a clear conviction to do this in our lives because it is our Great Commission. On this Solemnity of the Ascension, we acknowledge Christ seated at the right hand of the Father. May we ask him to pour out his Holy Spirit anew and enflame our hearts with the faith and conviction of the first Apostles.

### THIS &THAT FROM SR. YVONNE

#### "PAY ATTENTION TO JESUS!"

Today is our liturgical celebration of the Ascension of the Lord Jesus , forty days after Easter. The feast of the Ascension used to be a Holy Day of Obligation. Most diocese in the United States have moved the solemnity of the Ascension from Thursday to Sunday. Too many American Catholics were missing an important celebration in the Church year.

Our Gospel is taken from the conclusion of the Gospel of Mark 16: 15-20. There are similarities about the Ascension in Mark, Matthew and Luke. In each case the disciples are sent out to proclaim the gospel message to the whole world. The message from Mark and Matthew tells that the disciples are sent by Jesus to baptize and to preach. In Luke's gospel Jesus directs the disciples to return to Jerusalem to await the fulfillment of his promise to send the Holy Spirit. Only the gospels of Mark and Luke actually report Jesus' ascension into heaven. Matthew's gospel concludes with Jesus' promise to remain with his disciples forever. Today, the Gospel of Mark teaches that Jesus ascension affirms the glory that Jesus received from God after his death and Resurrection. From his place with God in heaven, Jesus helped his disciples, and continues to help us as we try to live as his followers. Mark uses the image of a seat to describe Jesus' place in heaven. When we pray the Creed each Sunday, we say that Jesus is at the right hand of the Father. We are not describing a physical place, but the honor that Jesus has because of the Father's love and approval of Jesus. From this place of honor in heaven, Jesus continues to help us as we try to follow his example. From my childhood I remember the discussions and arguments we had about where we were to sit at the table or when we went for a ride in the car. It may be important to sit in a particular place, but my parents usually settled that argument. So today we learn about Jesus' place in heaven. When we share our gifts, we do not stand around looking up at the sky like the disciples did in the gospel today. We are filled with the power of the Holy Spirit, and we evangelize. Our lives proclaim the joy of the gospel. We let the power of the Holy Spirit use the unique gifts that God has given us. We do what we are already doing in ways that invite people to see Jesus in us and the difference that Faith can make. So instead of looking up at the sky, look around and be aware of the power the Holy Spirit has given you. A relationship with Jesus Christ and his Church can transform the world, one person at a time. What is Jesus asking of you? We hear Jesus say in the gospel. "Go out into the whole world and proclaim the gospel to every creature." Like out west when a wagon train was traveling across the country, the cry would come early in the morning to "move on out." Our celebration of the Ascension today reminds each of us, to: "move on out," continuing to pay attention to Jesus. There is work to be done right here in the Chippewa Valley! Life never stays the same, but the essentials of our faith continue to call us to set our sights on what is ahead for us. God can draw good out of everything for those who love him. HAPPY ASCENSION DAY! Let us pray for each other!
