

#### **Ss. Philip and James** Feast Day: May 3

The relics of Saints Philip and James are still venerated in the crypt of the Twelve Apostles. James, Son of Alphaeus is also known as James the Lesser to avoid confusing him with James the son of Zebedee, also an apostle and known as James the Greater.

Philip came from the same town as Peter and Andrew, Bethsaida in Galilee. Jesus called him directly, whereupon he sought out Nathanael and told him of the "one about whom Moses wrote" (Jn 1:45). Saints Philip and James are the patron saints of Uruguay.

### From Fr. Jesse Burish

#### Praised be Jesus Christ!

Have you ever seriously considered the question: Am I, or will I be, saved? Will I make it to heaven? How do I know I am on the right path to salvation? These are questions that we should be asking ourselves. While we are not given individual certainty of salvation while we are in this world, we can know that we are on the right path if we have committed to being intentional disciples of the Lord. Our readings this Sunday offer us a picture of what

this life of discipleship should look like in the fruit it bears in our lives.

In our first reading from Acts of the Apostles, we see that the Christians in Jerusalem are afraid of Saul, because they do not know whether he is truly a disciple or an infiltrator waiting to betray them to the authorities. It takes the testimony of Barnabas, a disciple whom all trusted, to convince the Jerusalem church that Paul was sincere. Barnabas witnesses that Paul has had a direct experience of the Lord and that he was willing to put himself at risk by speaking "boldly in the name of the Lord."

This "boldness" in the original Greek refers to a willingness to speak the truth even when it is unpopular or may not be received well. When the Jerusalem church hears that Paul spoke "boldly," they received him as a true disciple because one of the marks of a true disciple is the willingness to face persecution and rejection for the sake of the Gospel. Weak, insipid, and "politically correct" speech intended not to communicate God's truth but to win the acclaim or acceptance from others can never be the Gospel. This, of course, does not mean we go out of our way to offend. The truth must be spoken with love because anything done without love is a sin. At the same time, true love can never lie or cover up the truth.

Then, in our Gospel, Jesus makes several striking points about the life of discipleship using the metaphor of a vine and a vine-dresser. Jesus says, "He (the Father) takes away every branch in me that does not bear fruit." Here, "fruit" refers to spiritual fruit, which would be growth in holiness, virtues, and good works. It is impossible to grow in holiness without also producing good works, because holiness does not take root in us without changing our behavior. Jesus is saying that those who are in Christ but refuse to grow in holiness, virtue, and good works will be removed from Christ. It's a frightening thought and a good warning not to fall into lukewarmness and spiritual sterility.

Then he says, "And everyone that does he prunes so that it bears more fruit." Pruning is a cutting process, and it can only be painful for the tree. Jesus is saying that those who are disciples will experience a kind of disciplinary process from God the Father so that they will grow in holiness. This disciplinary process can be painful. Sometimes those who serve the Church actively see this happen. Ministries, projects, or pastoral efforts that were fostered with much effort are suddenly cut off for various reasons, and we can question, "Lord, why did this happen?" This can lead to discouragement, but we must view it as a pruning process and seek to bear fruit in other areas.

"Whoever remains in me and I in him will bear much fruit, because without me you can do nothing." Only what Christ does in us will last; things done through human will and human desires will fade. While it is tempting for some, it makes no sense to cut ourselves off from the sources of communion with Christ like prayer, the sacraments, adoration, etc. and expect our lives still to have any kind of eternal significance.

Finally, "If you remain in me and my words remain in you, ask for whatever you want, and it will be done for you." This is because, if we remain in Jesus and his words remain in us, we will desire what he desires, and our will will be united to his such that "whatever we want" will only be his will, and his will will invariably be done. We enter into a total abandonment to God's Providence.

How do we know we are saved? How do we know we're on the right path to eternal life? We can, at least, have confidence that we are in Christ and he in us when we see tangible signs of the Holy Spirit working in our lives, signs such as those mentioned in our readings: willingness to be bold for Christ, and the bearing of "good fruit" (i.e., holiness, virtue, and good works) for the glory of the Father.

### THIS & THAT FROM SR. YVONNE

#### "CONNECTED TO TRUE POWER"

We've probably all experienced a power outage at some time in our life. When the power goes off, we look for batteries for out flashlight, a generator or a candle. Life isn't the same until the power comes back on. Our Gospel today is John 15: 1-8. John says that if we lose our connection to Christ, the source of our spiritual life, we become spiritually disoriented. Any substitute will only be temporary but eventually will fail us. We know that the power of God's love is never turned off. We may unplug ourselves from the true vine, and so we need to pray for the grace to remain connected to the true power of God. If we are not connected to the true vine, we cannot bear good fruit. We need to ask Jesus to be a part of everything we say and do to remain connected to true power. The master gardener knows that pruning is also important, because without it we won't have much of a garden. As I pass through the orchard area by St. Bridget's, I see the workers pruning the trees so that they might bear more fruit. We trust that God will help us through the pruning seasons of our life, so we stay connected to true power. Hundreds of years before Christ, the prophets used the vineyard as an image of Israel. Just as a farmer would cultivate his vineyard, care for it, and expect to harvest grapes from it, so God would care for his people and expect good works from them. The people were called to devout worship, obedience to his commandments, justice and love for the poor and vulnerable. There are five statements where Jesus uses a metaphor that tells how important it is that we remain united to him. Jesus tells us: "I AM THE GOOD SHEPHERD": "I AM THE LIGHT OF THE WORLD:" I AM THE BREAD OF LIFE:" "I AM THE RESURRECTION AND THE LIFE": and today: "I AM THE VINE AND YOU ARE THE BRANCHES." Some people have the inclination to wait until they become believers before they start going to church on Sunday, yet our gospel suggests that the opposite is true. If you find yourself not connected very well to God and you do want to believe, connect yourself with others who do live their faith from day to day. Even though we differ from each other in many ways, there is one thing that brings us together as Our Lady of the Falls Catholic Community and that is that we belong to Christ, we are united in him, like branches on a tree, or like a life-giving vine. We pray for all those who have cut themselves off from the Church and from Christ. May our example bring them back to the way of the Lord. The way we live our life shows whether we live in Christ or not and whether we are connected to True Power, that of the Resurrected Jesus. Greetings everyone and "HAPPY EARTH DAY!" Let us pray for each other!

#### **Cloverbelt Scholar-Athlete, Scholar Honorees and Selected Educators**




#### McDonell Alumni Association New Hall of Fame Inductees
