St. Thomas Aquinas (1225-1274) January 28

St. Thomas Aquinas surpassed all his fellow students in learning and virtue. He entered the Order of St. Dominic against his parents' wishes and persevered in his vocation. He studied under St. Albert the Great and at age 22 began teaching and publishing his first works. He was nicknamed the "dumb ox" because of his silent ways and huge size, but he was really a brilliant student. He wrote and preached often and was one of the greatest influential theologians of all time. St Thomas was canonized in 1323 and declared Doctor of the Church by Pope Pius V. He is the patron of universities and students.

Praised be Jesus Christ!

Our readings this Sunday convey the urgency and seriousness with which we are called to change our lives and follow Christ as his disciple. Our first reading from the book of Jonah provides a most ironic example of the foolishness of being slow to respond to God. The book of Jonah is different from the other Old Testament prophets in that it consists largely of a narrative that may be historical, or fantasy, or a little of both, to convey a

message of truth to Israel. The narrative is famous for its fantastic details, such as Jonah being swallowed by a great fish only to be later vomited up alive on the shore so that he can fulfill his call from God to preach repentance to the pagan/Gentile city of Nineveh.

Jonah had willfully defied God's express will for him to preach there by getting on a boat and sailing for Tarshish. The Gentile sailors on the boat, on the other hand, actively sought to be faithful to God's will. They woke Jonah and urged him to pray amid a storm on the sea. Even when they discovered that Jonah has thoughtlessly endangered the entire crew and cargo by making them complicit in his defiance against God by having him in the boat, the sailors showed humanitarian concern for Jonah's welfare and attempted to row ashore to save his life. Only with great reluctance did they cast him overboard, after which he is consumed by the fish. Then they piously offered sacrifice to the God of Israel in gratitude for being saved from the storm which then subsided.

The great irony of the story of Jonah continues as the response of the Ninevites to his reluctant preaching is surprisingly similar to that of the sailors. Jonah's preaching gives them no hope for salvation; it's just an absolute statement of imminent destruction: "Forty days more and Nineveh shall be destroyed!" Though given no reason for hope from Jonah himself, they engage in mass repentance in such a way that is hardly ever seen in Israel. They immediately throw themselves at the mercy of the God of Israel, while Jonah himself becomes angry that they actually listened, and that God had mercy on them. The great irony of the story is that the sinful pagan Ninevites, who are enemies of Israel, are being held up as examples of the kind of immediate repentance that is appropriate when we hear the word of God.

In our Gospel, St. Mark describes Simon, Andrew, James, and John dropping everything to follow Jesus immediately. It all sounds strangely abrupt, but we know from the other Gospels that there was a little more backstory to Jesus' relationship with these men. This was not the very first time they had seen or heard Jesus. Yet the point of Mark's narrative is correct: when the time came, these four Galilean men lost no time in responding to Jesus' call.

The response of the Apostles sets an example for us. Simon and Andrew "abandoned their nets," whereas James and John "left their father... in the boat." They gave up their profession and family relationships. All of us need to be ready to do that. Of course, for many of us, following Jesus faithfully may mean doing a better job at our professions or caring more deeply for our families. The point is not that professions or family relationships are inherently bad. Rather, it's that nothing can take priority over obedience to God.

Another significant way in which we seek to follow the Lord more closely is recognizing and striving to break free from the attachments that each of us have in life. Our attachments are those things that can become little gods for us: our expectations for things to go a certain way, certain material comforts or indulgences that we feel we cannot live without, immature dependencies we may have on other persons, or any other thing that puts a barrier between us and our full surrender to God and his will for our lives. To do this, it helps to take the approach of St. Paul in his first letter to the Corinthians, our second reading. We are to look on our most precious things in this world—our spouses, our temporal joys and sorrows, our property, and our jobs—as if they were already gone, because someday they will be, because all in this world is passing. What would you be most afraid of losing in order to gain Christ?

What is Jesus calling you to abandon in order to follow him today or this week? For some, it may be truly dramatic, like quitting your job or schooling and entering formation for the priesthood or religious life. For others, it may mean dropping that hobby or obsession that dominates your thoughts and affections and keeps you from prayer and truly giving of yourself to those around you. For still others, it may mean ending



a relationship that isn't healthy and isn't leading you toward Christ. Some of these things require discernment, and perhaps some spiritual counsel from a wise friend. Most of all, we all need humility to recognize where we have been sinful, where we have resisted what we know deep down inside to be God's will and word. We need to abandon that sin or attachment, reaffirm Christ Jesus as our king, and enter his kingdom.

THIS &THAT FROM SR. YVONNE

"NOW" is the time for me!

In the Gospel today, (Mk 1: 14-20) Jesus calls the fishermen, Simon and Andrew, James and John to be his disciples. There are a few things for which we would be willing to drop everything and follow the call. Yet this is the immediacy with which these first disciples responded to Jesus. These first disciples were willing to drop everything in order to make Jesus and the Kingdom of God the most important thing in their lives. Think about the times you were asked to "drop everything," changing your plans in order to help someone. For many of us, myself included, it is not easy to drop everything to respond to the needs of another. Jesus calls Simon, Andrew, James and John because he loves them and trusts them to share in his mission. Through our Baptism, we are called to be Jesus' disciples (followers) in whatever path our life takes. A few of us are called to serve through priesthood, diaconate or religious life, but most of us are lay folks, trying to follow the Lord the best that we can. So, if you are married, single, rich or poor we can give our best efforts to being faithful to God's call to be his disciples, wherever we are and whatever we might be doing. The remainder of Mark's gospel will show us just how difficult it is for the followers of Jesus to accept his message and pattern their lives on following him. When a couple says: "I do" on their wedding day, they mean it, but have little idea of the demands of living that promise for "better or for worse." The same was true for the disciples. They dropped their nets willingly enough, perhaps thinking they would have a new adventure, but discovered how hard the demands of not only abandoning their nets, but their very self to what would be expected of them as disciples. We can receive multiple callings in our life. Maybe at one time we are called to focus mainly on the needs of our family, or another time we might be called to meeting the needs of our brothers and sister, or by teaching others the faith, or for caring for the poor. We are grateful for the ways Jesus has called us. It is not always so easy to say "yes" because we know there will be hardships as well as joys. So it is NOW and not tomorrow, not even when we turn 80 or 90 years old, but **NOW** is the time to open our lives more to Jesus and to the gospel. As Our Lady of the Falls Catholic Community, let us pray for each other, to help others to come to the Lord. Together we offer the most perfect prayer when we come together for Mass. Jesus invites us too, to be fishers of women and men.
