

#### **St. Brigid of Kildare** (451-525)

Feast Day: February 1

St. Brigid became a nun in her youth. She founded a monastery and became abbess of the convent, the first in Ireland. It later developed into a center of learning and around it grew the Cathedral of Kildare. Brigid's gifts to the Christian world include helping lay the foundation of education for the laity through monastery schools which developed into the universities of the Middle Ages. Numerous miracles have been attributed to her, many of them having to do with the sick and the poor, which she helped.



#### From Fr. Jesse Burish



Praised be Jesus Christ!

Because our second reading this Sunday from St. Paul's first letter to the Corinthians alludes to it, I'd like to devote special attention to what the Church today refers to as "consecrated" religious life—sisters, brothers, and priests that are consecrated to God and either belong to religious communities and institutes or are single persons/consecrated virgins living in the world. These are men and women who have taken

vows of poverty, chastity, and obedience. We are blessed to have one such person (a consecrated religious sister) at St. Bridget, Sister Yvonne Hiess, SSND. Certainly, Notre Dame and Holy Ghost parishes have had their share of religious sisters teaching and serving in their parishes throughout their histories. But even more recently, we have the religious vocation of Sister Veronica of the Sacred Heart, a cloistered Poor Clare sister at a monastery just outside of Chicago. Sister Veronica grew up as Laura Kopp at Notre Dame Parish and graduated from McDonell in 2012. I visit Sister Veronica annually and I know that she prays frequently for our Catholic community.

To put it simply, what consecrated religious sisters, brothers, and priests demonstrate and remind the world of, particularly through the vows they take and the lives of prayer and service they live, is that life is NOT all about this world. In our second reading this Sunday, St. Paul says that while an unmarried man or woman can be more concerned about the things of God, a married man or woman's attention is divided. St. Paul is preaching a certain "preference" to be unmarried than to be married. He is not saying, however, that marriage is for less holy people.

St. Paul, in writing here, is trying to address some questions that the Corinthians sent him in an earlier letter, questions pertaining to marriage, and celibacy and virginity, among other things. It appears that in Corinth, there was a group within the Christian fold that began to assert that to be faithful and live a godly life, one should not marry and just remain celibate. Paul is actually trying to address this faulty belief and correct it. If one were to read the whole of chapter 7 in this letter, they would find that Paul begins speaking about marriage as something good and indissoluble.

But it's also clear that Paul does indeed give a certain preference to the vocation of celibacy and virginity. This does *not* mean that it would be better for everyone to forego marriage, or that priests and religious are inherently or automatically holier than everyone else. The preference or excellence of celibacy and virginity lies in the value of the sign or witness they bring to the rest of the world. This is a *special* vocation that certain people are *called to*.

While we know that someone who is unmarried may choose to live a self-centered life. But without the obligations of marriage and family, one can instead more fully dedicate themselves to serving the Lord and his Church, striving to give oneself away in love more inclusively rather than exclusively as in a marriage. It is supposed to be a sign and reminder of what **all** of our lives are directed to. All of us are called to holiness and to one day share eternal life with God in heaven. The world needs regular, radical reminders of that fact through the witness of those whose lives have such a singular focus.

Pope Francis has said that consecrated men and women are to "wake up the world" through their radical evangelical life, through following the Lord in a special way. May we continue to pray for a renewed openness on the part of our young people to such consecrated vocations and consider for ourselves how we may support them and promote them. One way is thanking and praying for those religious and consecrated persons we know.

## THIS &THAT FROM SR. YVONNE

#### "Walk The Walk And Talk The Talk"

The people who heard Jesus teach and saw him heal in today's Gospel (Mark 1: 21-28) were said to have been astonished and amazed by the authority of his teaching. Jesus' words and actions were so compelling that the news about him spread quickly throughout all of Galilee. The news about Jesus continues to spread. We spread the good news of Jesus with others in our words and in our deeds.

From the very beginning of his ministry Jesus seems to have dealt with a tough crowd. Whether in the streets or in the synagogue, he faced a conflicted crowd. Many were divided for all kinds of political and religious reasons (just as today).

In their synagogue a man with an unclean spirit was crying out. Evil was crying out and Jesus handled it. Jesus' first public act in the Gospel of Mark that is written down, is to free a human being from an evil spirit that has brought him chaos and destruction. This event reveals Jesus as the one who came to free us from all evil. Today, this is the work of all who follow Jesus.

When we experience disappointing behavior amongst others in our community or are even faced with larger scandals involving those in leadership, we need not lose our faith in Jesus. Instead, we can turn to Jesus and ask him to silence the voice of evil. We don't hear much about evil spirits these days, but we certainly know of their presence when we consider wars, murders, rapes and tortures that take place all around the world.

We pray the Lord's Prayer at Mass, which concludes: "and lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil" The power of evil has been overcome by Jesus' saving death, but we continue to pray that is does not find a home in us, in our Church and in our society. People were drawn to Jesus because He spoke with authority. We pray for our public officials that they might have insight and work for our good and protect us from all that is not right and just. Whoever truly listened to Jesus, could see that his actions mirrored his words and gave him authority. In Jesus the people heard and saw the power and authority of God at work. Let's pray that people will see in us and in our church the power and authority of God at work, too.

May it be so. .Let us pray for each other. Have a blessed week!
