St. Bernadette

Feast Day: April 16 (Jan. 7, 1844 – April 16,1879)

At the age of 14, Bernadette received apparitions of "a small young lady" who asked for a chapel to be built at a cave-grotto in Massabielle where the apparitions occurred in 1858. The lady who appeared to her identified herself as the Immaculate Conception. Bernadette later joined the Sisters of Charity of Nevers at the age of 22. She spent the rest of her brief life there, working as an assistant in the infirmary and later as a sacristan, creating beautiful embroidery for altar cloths and vestments. She eventually died of her long-term illness at the age of 35. St. Bernardette Soubirous was canonized in 1933 by Pope Pius XI. The little town of Lourdes became the site of pilgrimages, attracting millions of faithful Catholics every year. Astonishing healings began almost immediately in the miraculous water at the Shrine of Our Lady of Lourdes. Her body is incorrupt.





From Fr. Jesse Burish



Praised be Jesus Christ!

I'd like to propose for you that in the appearance of the Risen Christ recounted in this Sunday's Gospel reading, the Lord establishes three key features or gifts that will be experienced by every intentional disciple of his: his peace, his presence, and his purpose. Christ Jesus appears to the apostles and his first words are "Peace be with you." He gives them his peace because they were in turmoil, confusion, and guilt. These "followers" had

abandoned him and denied him despite their strong claims that they would do otherwise. They knew that they had betrayed their master. They were sorry but they couldn't turn back the clock. Jesus knows of their repentance. He comes now and says, "Peace be with you" to let them know that they were forgiven. That was why their fear turned to joy. They were forgiven!

This is the message of Christ to us in all the sacraments and in the Mass. It is the message of forgiveness that comes with repentance. Forgiveness and repentance go together. Unfortunately, many people today try to separate them. Some people love repentance and do it all the time but do not really believe that they can receive forgiveness, even if they have brought their sins to the sacrament of confession. Others want forgiveness without repentance, or without the Church and her sacraments, or without a sincere desire to change. If we keep repentance and forgiveness together, we have a wonderful Easter truth.

No matter what we may have done, whatever our past, however horrible the things we did, our repentance can bring new life, healing, forgiveness, and peace. We can become a new creation. Even though we have now moved through the season of Lent and passed Divine Mercy Sunday, I think it is still worth challenging any of us who might still be holding out on regular reception of the sacrament of confession. By going to confession, the Lord brings healing to our life that perhaps we don't even know we need. We give the Lord much more to work with in our life when we avail ourselves to him in this way.

The second feature of the life of every intentional disciple of Christ that flows from this time of Easter is Christ's presence, his real presence. "It is I myself." Today, Christ is truly among us through his Holy Spirit when we pray and when we gather with the Church in faith. He is present in the Eucharist as his most vivid way he would remain with us. He is with us not as a memory or as a model but as surely as he was with his apostles in the upper room.

The presence of Christ is a wonderful gift. As we look at all the individuals in church this Sunday, we can reflect on the fact that the Risen Lord is at work in the lives of each of them, each with his or her own story, his or her own needs, his or her own aspirations, and he is present to each as though that person were the only one. He comes to each one in the Eucharist with the particular graces that individual needs for his or her life. The enduring, lasting, permanent, real presence of Christ to us is Christ's second Easter gift to the apostles and to us.

Finally, besides his peace and his presence, the intentional disciple should also know his purpose given to us this Easter. The Lord sent the apostles to be witnesses of this new way of life, of this new truth that entered the universe. The Lord sends us to witness to the same truth. What is this truth that is to change our way of life? It's the same simple message I shared with you at Easter: (1) God loves you and has an amazing plan for your life, (2) Sin entered the picture and convoluted that plan, (3) God sent his Son to bring forgiveness, call you to repentance, and restore your relationship with him and his plan for your life, (4) God wants you to be part of his family, the Church, Christ's Body in the world, where he gives us the grace of the sacraments, and (5) We are called to make disciples... this is our purpose.

The fulfillment of this purpose has been witnessed by many faithful disciples and saints throughout history. Have you taken this summons seriously in your own life? Have you shared with anyone that message of truth, or the parts of it that people you know need to hear? Have you invited or encouraged someone in a life of intentional discipleship, encouraging them in regular and consistent prayer, participation in the sacraments, inviting them to greater fellowship, or encouraged them to learn and embrace the Faith more fully? Have you invited someone to take part in the Christian initiation process?

We're all used to making Lenten resolutions. Why not make an Easter resolution such as sharing the peace and presence of Christ with others or at least with one other person? The story of Easter was not finished with the Ascension of Jesus. Now we are part of the Easter story as the Lord's intentional disciples.



THIS &THAT FROM SR. YVONNE

"PEACE BE WITH YOU"

Easter is too big of a feast to celebrate just one day. We celebrate it for fifty days and then continue to celebrate it every Sunday when we gather in faith to meet our risen Lord in the Eucharist. Our gospel today takes us back to Easter Sunday. Luke 24:35-48. In the afternoon of Easter, Jesus appeared to two of his disciples walking away from Jerusalem. They were discouraged and depressed over Jesus' death. That is the Emmaus story that we heard during the week. Jesus appeared and walked with them, talking about the Scriptures. When he stopped and broke bread with them they recognized him. They came running back to the upper room to tell the others. Suddenly Jesus appeared to all of them, and they were afraid. To give them proof, Jesus asked for something to eat. Now they knew they were not seeing a ghost. The resurrection of Jesus is the most wonderful life-changing event ever. Because Jesus rose from the dead, evil, hatred and suffering have been overpowered. Yes, they are still hanging around, but their power has been broken by the alory of the Resurrection. Death has been overcome by life — eternal life. Every Sunday during the Creed. we profess that we believe in the "resurrection" of the body" because we believe that it was the fully human, fully divine Jesus who was raised from the dead. There are fourteen stories about Jesus' Resurrection in the four Gospels. Matthew emphasizes God's power with dramatic symbols like earthquakes and lightning. Mark focuses on the empty tomb. Luke emphasizes the living presence of Jesus in the scriptures and the Eucharist. John brings out the authority of the leaders of the early church. All of the stories convey the faith of the disciples that Jesus is alive. Through God's Power, life has triumphed over death. The disciples were given the mission to communicate this good news. Each Sunday we hear our priest celebrant or deacon say to us: "Go in peace to love and serve the Lord." The theme of peace is often stressed in the Gospel of Luke. Peace represents the fullness, the completion, the perfection of the blessings won for all by our Savior, Jesus Christ, Each time the risen Jesus appeared to his disciples he would greet them with: "PEACE BE WITH YOU." In the midst of our uncertainties, we, like the disciples, begin to recognize the Lord's presence when we find ourselves rooted in peace. This peace is different from the one that feeds our wants, yet it is the peace that helps us to recognize the presence of the risen Lord. We can see the importance of a sincere sign of peace when right before Communion we are encouraged to give a greeting of peace to our friends and neighbors. It depends on us to bring blessings to the world around us through the witness of our lives, our goodness, our love, our peace and our joy. As Our Lady of the Falls Catholic Community, let us pray for each other that we may bring the peace of Christ to each other, to our families, our community and our world. Have a blessed week!
