St. Francesca of Rome

Feast Day: March 9 (1384 – 1440)

Francesca was born in the city of Rome in 1384 to a wealthy, noble family. She wanted to become a nun but was forced to marry. Although the marriage had been arranged, it was a happy one, lasting for forty years. Francesca visited the poor and took care of the sick, inspiring other wealthy women of the city to do the same. During a time of flood and famine, she turned part of the family's country estate into a hospital and distributed food and clothing to the poor. According to one account, her father-in-law was so angry that he took away from her the keys to the supply rooms; but gave them back when he saw that the corn bin and wine barrel were replenished after Francesca finished praying. She founded the Olivetan Oblates of Mary in 1421, a religious order for widowed women that cared for the poor and sick. St. Francesca was canonized by Pope Paul V on May 9, 1608.



From Fr. Jesse Burish



Praised be Jesus Christ!

Since the beginning of Lent I've been speaking about a not-so-commonly-known word in the life of the Church: Mystagogy (pronounced "mis-tuh-gah-gee"). Mystagogy refers to a period following the Easter Vigil when someone who has just entered the Church (namely, by baptism) receives further instruction in the Faith in which the meaning of the sacraments and Catholic life is deepened. In part, this is to

help those newly received into the Church deepen their understanding of what happens in the Mass and the whole sacramental life of the Church.

You'll notice that starting this 3rd Sunday in Lent and going forward, our Gospel readings are drawn from John's Gospel, whereas before they came from Matthew. The reason we switch to John's Gospel is because John is, in so many ways "mystagogical." John's writing in very symbolic ways is intended to take us deeper into the "mysteries," that is, the sacraments of the Church, and this period of Lent is designed to help prepare those coming into the Church at Easter for their initiation.

In our Gospel reading this Sunday, Jesus and the Samaritan woman seem to be talking about drinking water but it's about more than that. The conversation we overhear is not just about her but very much about you and me as well. In biblical times, the well was the place where many people gathered. It was the place in a community where everyone had to go to get something they all needed for survival: water. In a sense, the church is our well. Here we gather with other Christians and here we too can meet the Lord, just as the Samaritan woman did. Through the Mass, the Lord speaks the truth of who we are, what we have done with our lives and what we can become if we follow him.

Throughout this Gospel runs this theme of the living water of God. "Everyone who drinks this water will be thirsty again; but whoever drinks the water I shall give will never thirst; the water I shall give will become in him a spring of water welling up to eternal life." This is the water of Baptism, the water of the Holy Spirit. Jesus would say later, "If any one thirst, let him come to me and drink. He who believes in me, as the Scripture has said, 'Out of his heart shall flow rivers of living water.'" Baptism was when our fundamental identity changed, and our relationship with God changed, and therefore our eternal destiny changed. Are you living as if you're baptized, or are you living as if you're not baptized? If sin has dried up your living waters and you have stifled your life in the Holy Spirit, perhaps this is a good week to return to the sacrament of Confession, that other sacrament that Church Fathers and doctors regarded as a kind of renewal of Baptism.

Now, just a word about one way in which our baptism is signified in the Mass. When we enter the Church, we dip our fingers in holy water and make the sign of the cross as a reminder of our baptismal identity in Christ. The Mass begins and ends with the sign of the cross. If we're paying attention, every time we make the sign of the cross, it should be for us a "mystagogy" experience. The sign of the cross is a visible sign of an invisible reality. In the sign of the cross, we recall our creation from the hands of the Trinity, and our recreation in baptism. The cross is our standard and protection as we are blessed with it going forward. In the sign of the cross we configure ourselves to Jesus and his cross.

Again, make this season a time of mystagogy—a deepening of what you have already received through Christ and his Church. Think about what your baptism means for you. Has it changed you, or what ways have you stifled its change in you? Think about the sign of the cross every time you make it, especially here in Mass in the church. What does it mean?

If we don't take the call of Lent to heart and strive for conversion and strive to deepen our awareness of our baptism and the Mass and the sacraments, then graces that God has given us bear little fruit in our lives. Come and drink of the overflowing well of Christ's Passion at this altar and renew that moment in your life when the waters of baptism made you a new creation.

Give Me Your Living Water

Today, we go from reading the Gospel of Matthew to the Gospel of John (John 4: 5-42). The dialogue between Jesus and a woman from Samaria is among the longest and most theological found in Scripture. It is a wonder that the conversation happened at all. Jesus, a Jew, was expected to avoid conversations with women in public. The bad feelings between Jews and Samaritans should have prevented the conversation as well. There was a rivalry between the Jews and the Samaritans.

Like the Jews, the Samaritans believed that a Messiah would come, but they also were influenced by the worship of other gods and they intermarried with foreigners—no love lost there. We can better understand the conversation if we consider the importance of water, especially in the climate of Israel and at the noon time of the day. One can live without food for days, but not without water. The disciples were in town buying food, so when the woman came to the well, Jesus asked her for a drink of water and the conversation began. The high point is when Jesus reveals himself to her as the Messiah.

After the conversation, the Samaritan woman becomes a disciple. Even though she is not a Jew she returns to town to lead others to Jesus: "COME AND SEE."

The townspeople return with her to meet Jesus for themselves and many come to believe in Him.

The encounter with Jesus has many levels for the Samaritan woman. First, she is converted to believe in Jesus as the Messiah, even though He knows her sins (many husbands) but He speaks to her just the same. The second level is social: The Samaritan woman becomes an evangelist to her own people: "COME

AND SEE." The third level is educational. Jesus uses this encounter to teach his disciples that God's mercy has no limits. The disciples return from their shopping confused because they found Jesus talking to this Samaritan, a woman at that! The townspeople began to believe in Jesus because they had heard for themselves that Jesus was truly the Savior of the world.

The Liturgy of today reminds us of our baptism. It is the water that began to quench our thirst for all that is good and worthwhile, for Jesus himself. Baptism is not just a ritual, but a new way of living, a lasting bond to the person of Jesus and union with the community of the Church. As the Catholic Community of Our Lady of the Falls, let us pray for each other, for our children and grandchildren so that we might live the promises of our Baptism. We are nourished by the Eucharist as we come together each week. Can we reach out to others and say like the Samaritan woman, "COME AND SEE?"



Decree from The Most Reverend William Patrick Callahan, Bishop of La Crosse

The disciplinary practice of abstaining from meat on the Fridays in Lent is an important dimension of the penitential nature of the season. This year, the Feast of St. Patrick, March 17, 2023, falls on a Friday in Lent. Given the many celebrations that occur on this day in accord with the norm of the law, I herewith grant to all Catholics of the Diocese of La Crosse as well as all present here that day, a dispensation from abstinence from meat and meat products. I encourage all who make use of this dispensation to engage in another sacrificial or charitable act that day.



Divine Mercy Sunday, a universal church Feast will be observed on the First Sunday after Easter Sunday, April 16. In her Diary, St. Maria
Faustina Kowalska recorded 14 revelations from our Lord requesting this
feast. The most complete, concise description is found in entry 699: "I desire
that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and a shelter for all souls, and especially
for poor sinners. ... The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy
Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment."

To receive the extraordinary graces of this feast, one must receive Holy Communion worthily on Divine Mercy Sunday, (or the vigil celebration),

by making a good Confession beforehand, staying in the state of grace and receive with great trust in Divine Mercy. We also are encouraged to venerate the Divine Mercy Image and perform acts of mercy through deed, word, or prayer. Our deanery program will be held at Notre Dame in Chippewa Falls. Please watch the bulletin for specifics in the near future.


