St.Peter Regalado Feast Day: March 30

Peter came from a wealthy and pious family in Valladolid, Spain. At the age of 13, he was allowed to enter the Conventual Franciscans. Shortly after his ordination, he was made superior of the friary in Aguilar. He became part of a group of friars who wanted to lead a life of greater poverty and penance. In 1442 he was appointed head of all the Spanish Franciscans in his reform group. Peter led the friars by his example. A special love of the poor and the sick characterized Peter. Miraculous stories are told about his charity to the poor. For example, the bread never seemed to run out as long as Peter had hungry people to feed. Throughout most of his life, Peter went hungry; he lived only on bread and water. Immediately after his death on March 31, 1456, his grave became a place of pilgrimage. Peter was canonized in 1746.

From Fr. Jesse Burish



Praised be Jesus Christ!

Over the last few weeks, I've been saying a lot about a word usually used at Easter time: Mystagogy. Mystagogy refers to a period following the Easter Vigil when someone who has just entered the Church (namely, by baptism) receives further instruction in the Faith in which the meaning of the sacraments and Catholic life is deepened. In part, this is to help those newly received into the Church deepen their

understanding of what happens in the Mass and the whole sacramental life of the Church. St. John in his Gospel during these weeks of Lent is very "mystagogical" in the sense that he draws us to reflect more deeply on the meaning of the sacraments in our life.

The Gospel reading this Sunday tells us of the last and greatest of Jesus' signs. The first half of John's Gospel tells us of many signs Jesus worked: signs of his love, his power, his saving mission such as changing water into wine, healing the royal official's son, healing the paralyzed man at the pool of Bethsaida, the multiplication of the loaves and fishes, walking on water and healing the man born blind which we heard last Sunday. These signs were carefully arranged by John to build up to the one we just heard today, his last and greatest sign. Notice, John does not refer to these acts of supernatural power as miracles but as "signs," because they all have a special significance; they indicate for us why Jesus came. Today's sign shows us most clearly why he came. As Jesus tells us in John's tenth chapter: "I came that they may have life and may have it to the full."

Ironically, in raising his friend Lazarus back to life, Jesus is unleashing the fury of the religious leaders in Jerusalem. How did that happen? It's because many more people started to believe in Jesus after Jesus raised Lazarus back to life and the Jewish leaders grew more determined to get rid of Jesus. They also planned to kill Lazarus if they could. As a sign, today's miracle pointed into the past to encompass the other signs that tell us who Jesus was and why he came, but it also points into the future. The raising of Lazarus pointed to Jesus' own resurrection. Through our baptism and fidelity to Christ, we hope in the same kind of resurrection.

The many signs of Jesus that John describes in his Gospel serve as a great introduction to our theme of mystagogy, i.e., raising our awareness of what is happening in the sacraments of the Church. A sacrament is defined as an efficacious sign of grace, instituted by Christ and entrusted to the Church, by which divine life is dispensed to us. Jesus is still very much working signs today and every day in his Church; signs that tell us who Jesus is and that point us to our future in eternity. The Church's sacraments and sacramental signs and symbols are filled with Jesus. They are one of the primary and favored ways that God shows himself to us today.

Earlier this Lent I spoke about the sign of the Cross that we make in the Mass as a reminder of our baptism and identity in Christ, as well as our creation and recreation in the Holy Trinity. When you make the sign of the cross at Mass (or at any time), make sure that you make a sign that is large and not rushed.

Recalling our baptism conforms us to Jesus and his priesthood and gives to each of us the power to offer sacrifice. When you come to the Mass, it is important that you come with your own prayers and intentions to offer, along with the joys and sorrows of your day-to-day life. At the Eucharistic Prayer, join these things to the sacrifice of Jesus at the priest's hands, offering them to God the Father.

When you receive Christ in Holy Communion, you are not only receiving a sign, but you are being transformed by Christ and into Christ. A great prayer that helps us to receive Christ well following Holy Communion is the one by St. Ignatius of Loyola: "Receive, Lord, my entire freedom. Accept the whole of my memory, my intellect and my will. Whatever I have or possess, it was You who gave it to me; I restore it to You in full, and I surrender it completely to the guidance of Your will. Give me only love of You together with Your grace, and I am rich enough to ask for nothing more. Amen."

As we approach Holy Week and Easter, may our understanding of who Christ is and our relationship with him grow through our deeper awareness of the signs and sacraments of his Church.

Divine Mercy Sunday, a universal church Feast will be observed on the First Sunday after Easter Sunday, April 16. In her Diary, St. Maria Faustina Kowalska recorded 14 revelations from our Lord requesting this feast. The most complete, concise description is found in entry 699: "I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and a shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners. ... The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment."

To receive the extraordinary graces of this feast, one must receive Holy Communion worthily on Divine Mercy Sunday, (or the vigil celebration), by

making a good Confession beforehand, staying in the state of grace and receive with great trust in Divine Mercy. THIS & THAT FROM SR. YVONNE

"COME OUT"

Even though Easter is still two weeks away, our Gospel today (John 11: 1-45) invites us to acknowledge Jesus' power over death, evidenced in the raising of Lazarus. Today's reading helps us to reflect upon what it means to call Jesus "the Resurrection and the Life".

Jesus had been in Jerusalem taking part in the Jewish feast of Hanukkah. The people have been pressing Him to declare plainly whether He is the Messiah. Jesus tells them to look to His works that testify to His coming from God. Many don't believe and try to stone Him for blasphemy.

Martha and Mary send word to Jesus that their brother Lazarus is ill. Even though Jesus loved his friends (Mary, Martha and Lazarus) He delays the journey for two days. The delay shows Jesus' obedience to God, who is to be glorified through Lazarus' resurrection. Finally Jesus says that he is going to Bethany to see about his friend Lazarus. His disciples fear for his life and Thomas declares that they should go along with Jesus and prepare to die with Him.

Martha is weeping when she meets Jesus, saying that if He had been there, Lazarus would not have died. Yet she remains confident that God will do whatever Jesus asks. Marthat affirms her belief that there will be a resurrection of the dead in the last days. Martha's sister Mary comes to Jesus saying that Jesus could have cured Lazarus. Jesus prays, weeps and then calls Lazarus from the tomb. Jesus' example shows us that it is human to be sad, and that our faith isn't somehow deficient if we grieve.

Lazarus was given a new lease on life but eventually he had to die, just like Jesus, just like our loved ones and just like us.

When Jesus tells Martha that He is the Resurrection and the Life, He is saying that we don't have to wait for resurrection at the end of life, we already have life through baptism and faith. Jesus gives us new life now, but it is our job to help free one another to live it — like someone had to unwrap Lazarus. The Gospel calls us today to come out of the tombs of our hardened hearts, out of the graves of our fears, doubts, depression, and mediocrity that keep us imprisioned. "COME OUT" is an invitation to us to rise from our sins and turn back to God. That was our Lenten invitation all along.

May we respond to the Holy Spirit's invitation to come out to a new life in Christ. God bless us all and let's pray for each other!


