From Fr. Daniel Sedlacek

Peace to you! It is my hope that by the time you are reading this, a summary "State of the Parishes" letter will have been made available to you via email or print. In it you will find an overall summary of our Catholic community from this past year and a financial summary for each of our parishes. Please take a look at it.

As we look forward to the rest of 2026, one thing that I very much am excited about is the launching of a seven-year "Spiritual Campaign." This effort is still in its beginnings - we don't even have a name for it yet! Nor have I ever heard of a Catholic parish or group of parishes do a "spiritual campaign" that spans multiple years. And so, we are working it out as we go. If you have ideas, please feel free to let me or one of the staff know!

There are a few reasons why I am moved toward this effort. The first is that the foundation of anything that we do or will attempt to do as followers of Jesus Christ must be rooted in prayer. So many efforts at parishes, in our families, and as individuals fail because we do not listen to the promptings of God the Holy Spirit. Whatever God desires for us in the next seven years, we want to be following His lead!

The second reason is that to be spiritually prepared for the Holy Year of 2033, which will be the 2,000th anniversary of the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of Jesus. Just like we have the season of Lent to prepare for the Sacred Triduum and Easter, so too we want to prepare ourselves for the "Triduum" of the Holy Year, where we will recall the center point of human history - the events of our salvation through Jesus Christ. We will be receiving graces all along the way toward 2033.

Some of the main graces we will be asking the Lord for are: Deeper personal conversion of heart, greater devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary, the conversion of relatives and friends, the ability to joyfully unite our sufferings to those of Our Lord, spiritual renewal in our families and in our clergy, and zeal for evangelization.

Our "campaign manager" for these seven years will be none other than Our Lady of the Falls, Mary our Mother. Our "guideposts" along the way will be her Seven Sorrows, one sorrow for each year. She will show us how to follow Jesus through all the joys and sorrows of life, how to remain united to Him in the midst of our sufferings, and how to more fully receive from Him the gift of salvation. — Fr. Sedlacek

THIS & THAT — "Do not be afraid" | The Gospels of Matthew, Mark, and Luke each include the story of the TRANSFIGURATION. Jesus goes up a mountain with his select disciples who get to see Jesus in his full glory, as brilliant as the sun. In the Old Testament, mountains are sacred places where people encounter God. The same is true here. God's voice comes from a cloud overshadowing the mountain, and God reveals to the disciples that Jesus is God's beloved Son. Moses, representing the Law, and Elijah, representing the Prophets, also appear with Jesus. The appearance of these two Old Testament heroes confirms that Jesus in the fulfillment of both the Law and the prophets. This is a key point for the author of Matthew. How does all of this apply to us? It gives us hope in our own times of suffering. The transfiguration is a visible manifestation of who Jesus is and where his sufferings would lead. God the Father spoke up to make things clear: "THIS IS MY BELOVED SON, WITH WHOM I AM WELL PLEASED." The apostles wanted to stay on the mountain. It was so wonderful experiencing God's glory as it was displaying itself in Jesus. The second Sunday of Lent is not too later for us to begin anew and resolve to make time to spend alone with Jesus on a daily basis. (maybe not on a

mountain!) In Matthew 17:1-9, the voice of God commands the disciples to listen to Jesus, and at the sound of God's voice, they are fearful. Jesus tells them not to be afraid. God the Father gives a word of guidance and direction to all who would follow his Son: "listen to Him." Together let us pray for each other as we listen to the call of the gospel and continue on our Lenten path of prayer, sacrifice and almsgiving. Have a blessed week and stay healthy. Hope to see you at the Stations of the Cross on Wednesday. — Sr. Yvonne
