From Fr. Daniel Sedlacek

Peace to you! We are getting close to the halfway point of Lent. Have your Lenten practices been drawing you closer to Jesus Christ? Have they been helping you grow in virtue? Our prayer, fasting/self-denial, and almsgiving/charity should be a means of our entering more fully into the life of grace.

One of our Catholic community's Lenten practices is forgoing the option of the sign of peace at our Masses this Lent. One reason is so that our community has an opportunity to learn more about this ritual, its history, and its meaning. The other reason is, I hope, that by forgoing and then reinstating it, we will more open to receiving the grace that is "hidden" within this traditional liturgical action.

I am not a liturgical historian, but I think some broad strokes of the rite of peace's history may be helpful. It was practiced in different forms over the centuries and in the various Catholic Rites. In the Roman Rite (most of us around here are Roman Catholic), placing hands on another's shoulders was practiced until around the 15th century. You may have noticed that this is how the Priests and Deacons at OLF exchange peace. This manner is called the "kiss of peace," and resembles the culturally normative way of greeting or parting from people in Italy, Spain, and other countries. From the 15th century until recently, the rite of peace was restricted to only the clergy and those who were in choir (altar servers, cantors, etc. . .). However, a practice between then and the 18th century was to give the laity the option to come forward during the rite of peace to kiss a tablet marked with the word "peace." This was called the "pax board."

The current version of the rite of peace was instituted after the Second Vatican Council. Here are the instructions about how to do it. After the deacon or priest says, "Let us offer each other the sign of peace," the Roman Missal states, "And all offer one another a sign, in keeping with local customs, that expresses peace, communion, and charity. The Priest gives the sign of peace to a Deacon or minister."

The General Instruction of the Roman Missal further instructs, "As for the actual sign of peace to be given, the manner is to be established by the Conferences of Bishops in accordance with the culture and customs of the peoples. However, it is appropriate that each person, in a sober manner, offer the sign of peace only to those who are nearest." A further instruction in 2004 states that priests should always remain in the sanctuary "so as not to disturb the celebration" during the rite, and reiterates that the laity should give the sign of peace in a sober manner and to those who are nearest them. - Fr. Sedlacek

THIS & THAT — "Don't talk to her" | On this third Sunday of Lent, the gospel from John 4:5-42 brings us to the well where Jesus meets the Samaritan woman. From the outside, she appears to represent a life of sin and separation. People judge her and mostly stay away from her. Jesus loves her and engages her in conversation. He shouldn't be talking with a Samaritan or a woman. Yet it is the longest conversation recorded in the New Testament. We learn in her conversation with Jesus that she is an outcast because of her "many husbands." She has no idea what living water he is referring to, but she stands and listens. We have to consider the importance of water, especially in the climate of Israel. At first the woman understands Jesus' promise of "living water" in a literal sense and says, "Sir, give me this water so that I might not be thirsty nor have to keep coming here to draw water." The significance of the encounter between Jesus and the Samaritan woman has many levels. The first is personal. The woman is converted to believe that Jesus is the Messiah, he knows her sins but speaks with her just the same. Having come

to know Jesus as the Messiah, the Samaritan woman becomes an evangelist to her own people. Jesus uses this encounter to teach his disciples that God's mercy is without limit. They return from their shopping confused to find Jesus talking with a Samaritan, and a woman at that! This gospel about the living water reminds us of the Sacrament of Baptism. As the Samaritan woman was converted and sent on a mission because of the conversation with Jesus, we too are converted and sent by our Baptism to preach the good news of Jesus to others. Each Sunday we are praying together the Prayer of Evangelization. We proclaim Jesus as our Messiah and ask for living water to quench our thirsty hearts. Have a blessed week and stay healthy!
