



From Fr. Jesse Burish



Praised be Jesus Christ!

What we celebrated on Christmas Day was the birth of Christ. What we celebrate today is the birth of Christ's Church, when the Holy Spirit, the same Holy Spirit who brought Christ to birth from Mary's womb on Christmas, brought to birth the Church, also known as Christ's Mystical Body, on the day of Pentecost. For the Holy Spirit is the soul of the Church, the invisible soul of the visible Church. The Holy Spirit is to the

Church what your soul is to your body: he is its very life.

Notice in this Sunday's first reading that the Holy Spirit came down publicly and visibly on the public and visible Church, not just privately and invisibly. Many people these days claim that they are "spiritual but not religious," meaning that their religion is private and individual and invisible only. In other words, their spirituality, as they might claim, doesn't subscribe to the clearly laid out beliefs of any public or visible institution. While the religion that Christ founded has private, individual, and invisible elements, it is also public and communal and visible, especially in its sacraments. "Spiritual but not religious," examined more closely, is really a contradiction in terms. To claim to be truly "spiritual," it follows that there must be some set of beliefs one holds that underlies that spirituality. For one's beliefs or religion to be completely private, individual, and invisible, or undefined, it usually translates to a form of narcissism—a self-serving spirituality of just doing whatever one wants, thinks, or feels in the moment. To worship merely privately, to worship "the God within" only, is to worship yourself, which is a form of idolatry.

The form of worship on the other extreme is to worship merely publicly and externally, to worship the visible institution or its laws. There are people who succumb to this tendency as well, but probably not as many as those who succumb to the former in today's world. God invented the Church for us human beings, and we are both body and spirit, both exterior and interior, both visible and invisible. That is why the Bible always joins faith to Baptism, faith to works, the spiritual to the material, and the invisible to the visible.

Every Sunday we profess our faith in the Nicene Creed in which we state what are called the "four marks of the Church." "I believe in one, holy, catholic, and apostolic Church." We do not profess our faith in thirty thousand denominations, all of which teach different doctrines and none of which have apostolic succession (i.e., tracing the consecration of our bishops back to the Apostles), as only the one true Church has. The Church is a visible institution because it is apostolic, in which her sacraments find their validity through the validity of her Holy Orders, which finds its validity in apostolic succession. The Apostles were concrete, visible human beings whom Christ ordained and who ordained successors, bishops, for the rest of time. For two thousand years they have been, and are, one and holy and Catholic, or universal, in their official teaching (though far from perfectly unified or perfectly holy in their practice). That is why we are here: because we want the whole deal that God dealt out to us at Pentecost.

Our second reading this Sunday from St. Paul's first letter to the Corinthians reminds us that the Holy Spirit is given to this visible Church and to each individual Christian as well. Frequently, when we think of the work of the Holy Spirit, we select the extraordinary gifts of the Holy Spirit such as people speaking in tongues and being gifted with healing or great inspirations. There are also the ordinary gifts of the Holy Spirit that we can easily overlook. These are the gifts that bring inner healing to the broken soul, the gifts of the Holy Spirit that enable us to forgive, to have the power to be faithful to our promises and vows, the Spirit that can bring us back to a living faith, a renewed trust in God, the gift of the Holy Spirit that enables us to enter into prayer sincerely, honestly, and powerfully. If we think about it, all of these gifts are given or strengthened through our worthy reception of the Church's sacraments. We might recall from our confirmation some of these ordinary gifts: wisdom, understanding, knowledge, counsel, piety, fortitude, and fear of the Lord. The Holy Spirit really is, as we say in the Creed, the Lord and Giver of life to the Church and to our soul.

Pentecost is a day of great hope, joy, and strength for us baptized men and women, individually and for the whole Church which Christ has visibly established. The Holy Spirit which enlivens the Church is Christ's magnificent Easter gift to you and me.

What is MACS doing to plan for the future?

- Throughout the course of our parish Inspired by the Spirit capital campaigns, many people have asked about how our Catholic schools and how their needs will be addressed.
- MACS engages a systematic strategic planning process every 5-7 years. By spring 2024, MACS will launch a new strategic plan. The hope is to undertake a feasibility study and major capital campaign by 2030. Possibilities for the future include:

McDonell school building:

- Extensive remodel of academic wing and auditorium/worship spaces
- Potential gymnasium addition
- Classroom addition to add capacity

Two options for an elementary rebuild:

- Demolition and rebuild/extensive remodeling at one or more parish sites
- Construction of a new school building on a new site (may serve elementary needs or upper grades)

Future possibilities yet to be determined by updates to long term master-planning.

HAPPY BIRTHDAY CHURCH!

On Pentecost we celebrate the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the apostles gathered in the upper room in Jerusalem (John 20: 19-23).

The Season of Easter concludes with today's celebration of Pentecost, and it marks the beginning of the Church (Happy Birthday Church). For seven weeks we have been hearing Christ's good news, so celebrating Pentecost at the conclusion of the Easter season makes sense. It is like celebrating Christmas in May. We celebrate the gifts of the Holy Spirit which are meant to be unwrapped, used and shared.

Like the apostles who faced challenges, we as the Church face challenges. We are elders, children, families, singles, widows, conservatives, liberals, converts and cradle Catholics. Although we are people of diverse backgrounds, we move forward from this Easter season remembering that we as the Church are one in the Spirit. The Spirit is Jesus standing in our midst, walking with us, directing us and gifting us for the work of the kingdom. St. Paul reminds the Corinthians and us that there are different kinds of spiritual gifts, but the same Spirit.

We all need a generous share of these gifts in our day-to-day lives. In the Eucharist, the words said by the priest right before the consecration, "Let your Holy Spirit come upon these gifts to make them holy" means the Holy Spirit is given to us. Oh Happy Day!

Jesus' word of peace to his followers should encourage us to speak "peace" to each other. It can make saying "God bless you" a wonderful gift to each other. So have a blessed week and GOD BLESS US ALL! Let us pray for each other as we share the Gifts of the Spirit!


