

#### St. Damien de Veuster (1840-1889)

Feast Day: May 10

Father Damien, born Jozef De Veuster, was a Roman Catholic priest from Belgium and member of the Congregation of the Sacred Hearts of Jesus and Mary, a missionary religious order. He won recognition for his ministry to people with leprosy, who had been placed under a government-sanctioned medical quarantine on the island of Molokai in Hawaii. After sixteen years caring for the physical, spiritual, and emotional needs of those in the leper colony, he eventually contracted and died of the disease, and is widely considered a "martyr of charity". He was the tenth person recognized as a saint by the Catholic Church to have lived, worked, and/or died in what is now the United States.



#### From Fr. Jesse Burish



Praised be Jesus Christ!

In 1967 the Beatles wrote and performed for one of the first worldwide TV broadcasts a song called, "All You Need is Love." It became a classic, and it's one of a number of Beatles songs where they stumbled on something true out of their Christian heritage, without understanding the full implications. In fact, it may be argued that they actively distorted the real implications of the Christian understanding of love. Perhaps it could be said that

"All You Need is Love" is the theme for our readings this Sunday. As we will see, however, our readings define "love" in a far more demanding way than the Beatles would have.

This comes out most clearly in our Gospel this Sunday from John. Jesus says, "As the Father loves me, so I also love you. Remain in my love. If you keep my commandments, you will remain in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and remain in his love." Perhaps it seems odd, if you think about it, to see the word "love" and "commandment" put together in such a way. I don't know about you, but I have a hunch that the Beatles weren't thinking anything about commandments when they first sang, "All You Need is Love." We tend to feel immediately happy about the word "love," but unhappy, or at least constrained, about the word "commandment" or "command." We think of love as expressing our will, while commandments often go against our will.

One of the main reasons why it seems strange that love and commandments go together is because we have a confused understanding of love. Our English language makes it easy for us to get love confused because we only have one word that is used to describe what are in fact several different things. The ancient Greek, in which the New Testament was written, was much more specific. There are four different words found in the New Testament that are all translated as "love" in English: *agape*, which means the gift of yourself to another; *philia*, which means friendship, the respect and admiration between two people; *eros*, which refers to passionate or romantic desire; and *storge*, which means spontaneous, natural affection.

In our Gospel, Jesus uses only the words *agape* and *philia*, i.e., love that is self-giving and the love of friends. The love Christ is talking about, which is the love between us and him, and which he also says exists between him and his Father, is not the romantic love (*eros*) you feel for someone that you're attracted to, or the spontaneous affection (*storge*) that you feel for your dog. The love God has for us is *agape* or self-giving love because God gives himself wholly to us, first of all in creating us, because that was wholly for our benefit, not his. And, in suffering and dying for us, which was also for our benefit, not his. And since we are created in God's image, our lives must image his love. God's love for us is also *philia*, or friendship, because God, incredibly, wants to be friends with us. Yes, he enjoys our company! It's like a human being enjoying the company of an insect and making friends with it.

Again, the love Jesus is talking about is self-giving and friendship, but he identifies this love with obedience to his commandments. To love God is to obey his will. That is the concrete proof of love. For Jesus, love is obedience and obedience is love. Perhaps this idea is uncomfortable to us because we only think of love horizontally, between ourselves and other imperfect human beings. But Christ first thinks of love vertically, between ourselves and God. On a merely human level, it's understandable that we would have reservations about obedience equated to love. We might love someone with an addiction and choose not to obey them by supporting their bad habit. We also find it easy to obey people that we don't necessarily love, especially if we're motived by fear of negative consequences (such as with a boss or slave driver).

But even when it comes to our relationship with God rather than other human beings, we don't usually see love and obedience to God's commandments as identical. We think we can love God even when we don't obey him, and we think we can obey him even when we don't love him. I can think of many Christians who tend to fall into either one of those camps. Many believers are quick to acknowledge that they don't accept many of the Church's moral teachings and choose to do things their own way. Many believers also live lives of merely fulfilling their religious duties but are motivated primarily by habit or fear. They don't strive for a real relationship with God or real conversion.

How can we strive to put love and obedience together in our relationship with God? For starters, we need to begin to change how we think about love and how we think about obedience. We need to change our concept of love from being a feeling to a choice, a choice to obey, a choice of the will. Second, we need to change our concept of obedience from reluctant duty to an eager hope. Love is essentially an act of the will, not a feeling; and the act of the will is to choose, either to obey or disobey. The words "thy will be done" is an essential

component to our prayer. We pray it all the time in the Lord's Prayer, but we don't often mean it. Love is more challenging when things don't go our way, or we don't get what we want.

It's worth noting that in our Gospel, Jesus is not saying that if we stop obeying his commandments, he will stop loving us, but he is saying that if we stop obeying his commandments we will stop remaining or abiding in his love. The sun will not stop shining if we close our eyes, but we will no longer see its light. Many Christians have hearts that are closed off to God's love, but that's often because they're closed off to obedience in one way or another. In our relationship with God, love is obedience and obedience is love, and in that love we are his friends.

#### THIS &THAT FROM SR. YVONNE

#### "THREE LITTLE WORDS......GOD IS LOVE"

It may seem to most people that we celebrated Easter a month ago, but the Church continues to celebrate it for a few more weeks. Today's gospel is from John 15: 9-17 and it follows after the gospel of last week. We recall that Jesus taught that he was the vine and that his disciples were the branches. (that's us too.) Our union with Jesus will lead to fruitful service. Today's gospel describes the kind of service that we are called to offer to others. At the Last Supper Jesus spoke this commandment to them: "Love one another as I have loved you." Jesus showed how much he loves us by his sacrifice on the cross for their sake and for ours, too. Jesus gave us the same commandment he gave to his disciples. Following Jesus, we follow his example of love in action. In family life, we have many opportunities to show love in action. Each time we postpone a task that we wanted to do in order to tend to the needs of another, we are following the example of love shown us by Jesus. Sometimes the sacrifice we are called upon to make for others is small. We are called to be generous and to give freely without counting the cost. This is a demanding love, as it commits us to love not only those we like, or those who love us, but also the difficult one, the "unlovable" people who are far from perfect, the outsiders. That is not so easy, and this is probably why he calls it a commandment.

If we were going to give a name to this Sunday in the Easter Season, we might call it "Love Sunday." Love is every struggle to build a world better than the one we received and upon which others will build even further. We lay down our life for others, by making daily sacrifices. In doing this, we bring the love that is God to all those around us. Love is really the key to everything: it explains why God created us, it explains why Jesus came to earth, it explains why God wants us to live with him forever, it explains why we come together weekly to celebrate the Mass, and it explains how we are to act with love toward each other.

God of love, teach us how to love well by following the example of love that you have shown us in Jesus. Whether at home, at work, or at school, help us to love others as you have loved us. Give us the courage, patience and faith so that we can bring to reality, along with the help of the Holy Spirit, a more loving and just world. Let there be love and friendship in our families, church and in our community. HAPPY LOVE SUNDAY! Have a blessed week and let us pray for each other.
