### **Saint Anthony of Egypt** (c. 251–356)

Feast Day: January 17

At 20, Anthony was so moved by the Gospel message, "Go, sell what you have, and give to [the] poor" (Mark 10:21b), that he actually did just that with his large inheritance. Anthony decided to become a hermit. He begged an elderly hermit to teach him about the spiritual life. Anthony also visited other hermits so that he could learn each one's most outstanding virtue. Then he began his own life of prayer and penance alone with God. Many people heard of his holiness and came to him for advice. Anthony would tell them how they could become closer to God. Once he said, "The devil is afraid of us when we pray and make sacrifices and when we are humble and good. He is especially afraid when we love Jesus very much. He runs away when we make the Sign of the Cross." Anthony died in solitude at 105. (Also known as Anthony of the Desert.)



### From Fr. Jesse Burish



Praised be Jesus Christ!

How do I know God is calling me to do something? How do I know his will for my life, or for any number of specific situations in my life? These are questions that inevitably arise for anyone who is striving to be a disciple of Christ. Our first reading this Sunday from the Old Testament first book of Samuel is a story that brings these questions to the surface. God calls this young boy Samuel while he is asleep. Samuel, not knowing it is the Lord,

thinks it is the priest Eli and goes and wakes him up, until eventually Samuel figures out (with the help of Eli) that it is *God* speaking to him, and finally Samuel avails himself to God's call and will.

The situation, however, that surrounds this story is a rather troubling one. The two sons of the priest Eli, whose names are Hophni and Phineas, were corrupt. They used their positions of authority to take advantage of people. Eli, unfortunately, was a rather weak leader and father. He never really cracked down on his sons. By the time he did say something, it was too late and had no effect. This whole ugly situation that Samuel finds himself in during his youth in the temple really provides a powerful reflection for us about how we listen to God and discern his will in our life.

Notice that the passage began by saying that Samuel was sleeping in the temple of the Lord where the ark of God was. Perhaps this is an indicator that something is not quite right. In other places in the Bible being asleep is not the posture that one wants to have in the presence of God. Recall Jesus telling his disciples to stay awake and keep vigil with him in the Garden of Gethsemane just before his Passion. We must be spiritually awake and attentive to God's often subtle voice, namely by not being distracted by material things or worldly pursuits. Also, the existence of unconfessed or unrepented sin/corruption/lack of integrity hidden away in our lives is a sure way to drown out God's voice and prevent us from hearing him.

So, how are we to know that God is speaking to us or calling us to something? How are we to know his will? In his book entitled *In the School of the Holy Spirit*, spiritual author Fr. Jacques Philippe proposes several criteria confirming that an "inspiration" comes from God. His first point for our discernment is that God is consistent and doesn't contradict himself. In other words, God doesn't call us to do anything that contradicts the teaching of the Scriptures or the Church, or the demands of our vocation.

Another criterion for discerning God's inspiration or voice comes from Jesus' words in the Gospel: "A tree is known by its fruit." If something is from God, it should produce within us peace, joy, charity, communion, and humility, as opposed to sadness, bitterness, or pride. Of course, this may only become obvious to us in retrospect, but we can gain experience for future discernment, and some of these fruits may become apparent to us even before putting a decision in effect.

Peace, joy, and the like are certain fruits of the Holy Spirit; the Devil is incapable of producing them in a lasting way. By contrast, trouble and persisting sadness are the sure marks of the evil spirit, and the Holy Spirit cannot produce them. In practice, however, things are often more complex. An inspiration may come from God and still cause a lot of turbulence in us. But this turbulence comes from our resistance to that inspiration. Once we accept it in docility and cease putting up resistance, then we find peace little by little pouring into our hearts.

One final criterion for discerning something coming from God is constancy. There is nothing more inconstant than our moods and wishes. The tactic of the Devil is to distract us, pushing us in one direction and then another so that, in the end, we accomplish nothing at all. What comes from God, however, is stable and constant. For this reason, it's generally good to take some time to discern something is coming from God to verify that it doesn't quickly dissipate.

There is, of course, much more that could be said about hearing and discerning God's voice/inspiration/will in our life, but for now, I'll leave it at that. God's call sometimes disrupts our comfortable lives. But if God wants our response, he'll keep calling, like he did with Samuel, as long as we do not have our hearts completely blocked or distracted from hearing him.



#### **Bishop Barron Comments on Recent Vatican Document**

While I included a couple resources on the recent Vatican document on blessing of same-sex couples in my Friday email to parishioners, I'd also like to offer this brief commentary by Bishop Barron, dated Dec. 21, 2023, found on the USCCB website, WASHINGTON — The document released this week by the Vatican on the pastoral meaning of blessings insists that marriage is a union of one man and one woman in lifelong fidelity and openness to children, said Bishop Robert Barron of Winona-Rochester. Following the publication of Fiducia supplicans by the Vatican's Dicastery for the Doctrine of the Faith, the chairman of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops' (USCCB) Committee on Laity, Marriage, Family Life, and Youth, addressed questions and concerns that have emerged. "In my capacity as chairman of the USCCB Committee on Laity, Marriage, Family Life, and Youth, I would like to respond to some of the questions and concerns that have emerged in the wake of the publication of the Vatican document, Fiducia Supplicans. The statement in no way calls for a change in the Church's teaching regarding marriage and sexuality. In fact, it goes to great lengths to insist that, in accord with unchanging doctrine, marriage is a union of one man and one woman in lifelong fidelity and openness to children. "The blessings that it allows for those in irregular relationships are not liturgical in nature and hence do not imply any approbation of such relationships. Rather, these benedictions are informal and spontaneous, designed to call upon God's mercy to heal, guide, and strengthen. Despite some misleading coverage in the press, the declaration does not constitute a 'step' toward ratification of same-sex marriage nor a compromising of the Church's teaching regarding those in irregular relationships. "Fiducia Supplicans is very much congruent with Pope Francis's longheld conviction that those who do not live up to the full demand of the Church's moral teaching are nevertheless loved and cherished by God and invited to accept the Lord's offer of forgiveness."
