#### St. Bede the Venerable

Feast Day: May 25

Born near St. Peter and St. Paul monastery at Wearmouth-Jarrow, England, Bede was sent there when he was three. He became a monk at the monastery, was ordained when thirty, and spent all of his life in the monastery, devoting himself to the study of Scripture and to teaching and writing. He is considered one of the most learned men of his time and a major influence on English literature. Called "the Venerable" to acknowledge his wisdom and learning, the title was formalized at the Council of Aachen in 853. He was a careful scholar and distinguished stylist, the "father" of English history, the first to date events *Anno Domini* (A.D.), and in 1899, was declared the only English doctor of the Church. He died in Wearmouth-Jarrow on May 25, 735.



## From Fr. Jesse Burish



Praised be Jesus Christ!

One of the best indicators or proofs of the continued presence and working of the Holy Spirit in the Church, especially at times of difficulty or strain or corruption, has been the presence of great saints. Saints, by their holiness of life and witness, help us to discern and see what is good and true amid a lot of darkness and confusion. One such saint is St. Philip Neri, who lived in Rome in the 1500s, a time in which there was a lot of trouble in

the life of the Church. At a time in which there was a lot of corruption and needed reform, St. Philip and a number of other saints around his time, by their own life of prayer and zeal for the Gospel, brought about a tremendous grassroots spiritual renewal in the Church.

There is a great story about St. Philip that somewhat connects to today's feast of Pentecost. On the vigil of Pentecost in the year 1544, when Philip was 29 years old and still a layman, he went to pray all night at the then-partially rediscovered catacombs of St. Sebastian in Rome. It was there that he had a vision of the third person of the Holy Trinity who had taken on the appearance of a ball of fire (fire being a biblical image for the Holy Spirit) that entered his mouth, descended into his heart, and caused an explosion of heat and love. It sounds like a strange story, but it's been said that after Philip's death, an autopsy revealed that he had a physical heart that was greatly enlarged, so much so that it had broken outward two of his ribs. Sometimes with God, he allows spiritual realities to manifest themselves physically to give a more powerful witness.

What happened to St. Philip teaches us something very important about the solemnity of Pentecost that we celebrate this Sunday. We must not just know about the Holy Spirit, but we should know him personally to allow him to enter us as a tongue or ball of fire, or in whatever more subtle way he wants. This feast is about giving the Holy Spirit permission to come into our lives. It's about becoming docile and fully cooperative with his work in us.

I'd like to propose for you two other areas for knowing and personally experiencing the Holy Spirit in your life. They are: (1) prayer and (2) charisms. Through prayer, simply by virtue of our baptism, the Holy Spirit intercedes for us. Often, we do not really know what we should pray for. We don't always know what the best thing for us is to ask for. When James and John asked to sit at the right and left places of Christ in his Kingdom, Jesus told them that they didn't know what they were asking for. We're kind of like that. But to recognize that we do not know for what to pray is an indication that we are on the path to be guided by the Holy Spirit. Too often our prayers tend to be mere blueprints that we bring to God to rubber-stamp. But when the Holy Spirit quides, prayer immediately rises above the level of just our petition and what we think we needs to happen.

The Holy Spirit also intercedes in us that we may pray. He puts our hearts in a right disposition if we are listening for him. He increases our boldness in asking for what we truly need or desire if it be God's will. He suggests the things for which we should pray and gives us his power.

The other way we through which we know the Holy Spirit is through what we call charisms. We must discern our charisms. What's a charism? A charism is a special grace or gift given to us by the Holy Spirit which directly or indirectly benefits the Church, or it is given to help us live out the Christian life, or to serve the common good in building up the Church. There are several examples of charisms listed in the New Testament: prophesy (i.e., speaking on behalf of God to upbuild or encourage), prayer for healing, mercy, teaching, almsgiving, perseverance, joy, hospitality, leadership, etc. What special spiritual gifts do you have that God may want to use or is already using to build up the Church or live your Christian life in a fuller way? This is something every one of you should be praying about. See the Holy Spirit at work in your life in the charisms he is giving you.

We live in challenging times. Even more reason to invoke the Holy Spirit and to draw closer to him, and to discern his powerful action in our life and in the Church, especially in how he is working in us through prayer and charisms. For through those areas, especially, he desires to light a fire within us as he did to St. Philip Neri, so that we may be saints for our own day. The Holy Spirit does not abandon us or abandon the Church. This is the Lord's promise to us, and it is the witness of the saints up and down the centuries.

## THIS &THAT FROM SR. YVONNE

#### "HAPPY BIRTHDAY CHURCH!"

We are now at the end of the season of Easter. It's Pentecost Sunday and we are celebrating the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the apostles gathered in the upper room in Jerusalem. This event marks the beginning of the Church. The story of Pentecost is found in the first reading today from the Acts of the Apostles. The Gospel from John 20:19 also tells how Jesus gave the gifts of the Holy Spirit to his disciples. After his death, Jesus fulfilled his promise to send to his disciples a helper, an advocate, who would enable them to be his witnesses throughout the world. So, bring out the birthday cake and let's sing: "HAPPY BIRTHDAY CHURCH!" Each of us have been given the gift of the same Holy Spirit, the same Holy Spirit that is the very life and breath of Jesus. This Holy Spirit now breathes with us, in us, and through us. Jesus' words of peace to his followers can help us to speak peace to each other. We can say: "God bless you" and extend God's peace to each other. Some people have GPS devices in their car. It gives directions after you type in your destination. It never complains or criticizes. Even when you ignore what it is saying, it simply recalculates and changes as it has only one purpose and that is to guide you safely home. Coming from the Father, the Spirit's purpose is to bring us to the one who is the Truth, to bring us safely home. We remember from our Confirmation the Fruits of the Spirit and the Gifts of the Spirit. The Fruits of the Spirit are personal qualities such as love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control. The Gifts of the Spirit include wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge, piety and fear of the Lord. And the greatest of all the gifts is the Spirit's gift of Love. We are the elders and children: families, singles, and widows. We are conservatives and liberals in politics and faith. We are converts and cradle Catholics. We are people of diverse roots and ways of life. But as the Church, we are one in the Spirit. It is sad that many times I am not even aware that God's Spirit is helping me. Only as I look back, can I see the movement of the Spirit keeping me sane through difficult times, giving me ideas when I couldn't think of the right thing to say, encouraging me when I was afraid, helping me to pray when my spiritual life seemed "blah" and giving me peace when I lacked it. Thanks to the Spirit of Jesus I am gifted and blessed in so many ways. The Spirit was also given to the Church to direct and guide it and help it to grow. It remains our task as Church today, as a community of believers, to proclaim God's love, to share God's gifts with others to the extent that we are able.
